

LISTS OF COUNTRIES 2008

Summary:

- Overall, ETC implements its activities in 70 countries (compared to 69 in 2007 and 62 in 2006);
- Referring to the DAC List of ODA Recipients ETC is active in 29 Least Developed Countries, 12 Other Low Income Countries, 19 Lower Middle Income Countries and Territories and in 8 Upper Middle Income Countries and Territories (in 2007 the distribution was 28-13-17-9 and in 2006: 25-10-16-7);
- Furthermore, ETC works in 33 DGIS partner countries (in 2007: 26 and 2006: 23);
- Related to the new DGIS country categories: Accelerated success on MDG's: 16, Security and development: 9, Broad relation: 6, Additional fragile states: 2
- ETC stopped working in 3 countries (Costa Rica, Nicaragua and Romania);
- But implements new activities in 6 (Georgia, Occupied Palestinian Territories, Malawi, and UK)
- Programmes are active in 49 countries and ETC did (short term) projects in 57 (in 2007: 49 and 56 and in 2006: 47 and 44).

Under 'programmes' the countries in which we work on a regular base; co-operation with partners

Under 'Units' those countries in which we did (short term) projects

NB Countries in which we have a relation with a funding agency only (like Belgium, the EU in Brussels) are not included in the list

E: The Netherlands will phase out the development relation with: Bosnië-Hercegovina, Eritrea, Sri Lanka. F: Where needed the focus is on other fragile states such as Zimbabwe, Bolivia or Lebanon.
 3. Broad relation: Egypt, Georgia, Indonesia, Moldavia, Suriname, South Africa, Vietnam. E: The Netherlands will phase out the development relation with: Albania, Armenia, Cape Verde and Macedonia FYR
